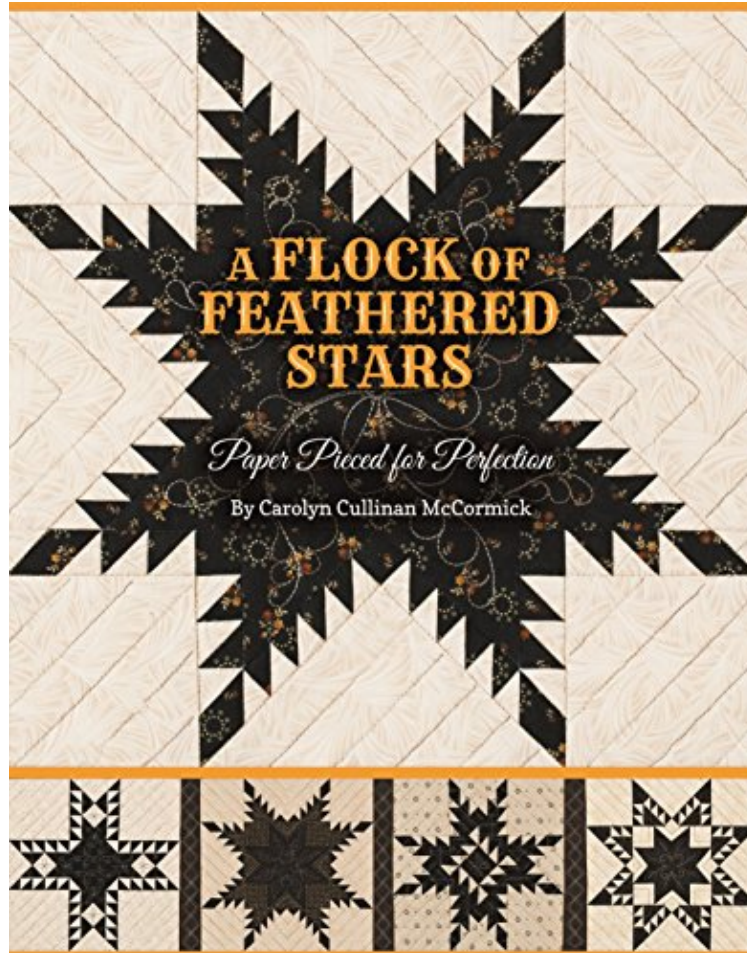

About the Author Carolyn Cullinan McCormick lives in Franktown, Colo., which is just a hop, skip and a jump from Denver, with her husband and two children. McCormick started quilting in 1985, when she and her family moved to Bozeman, Mont. She taught a variety of quilting and craft classes from 1987 to 1995. In 1995, she invented the Add-A-Quarter ruler to make rotary cutting of templates easier. The Add-A-Quarter has now become a standard tool for paper piecing. McCormick has invented other tools as well: the Add-An-Eighth, Add-Three-Eighths and the Add-Enough make life much easier for quilters.
