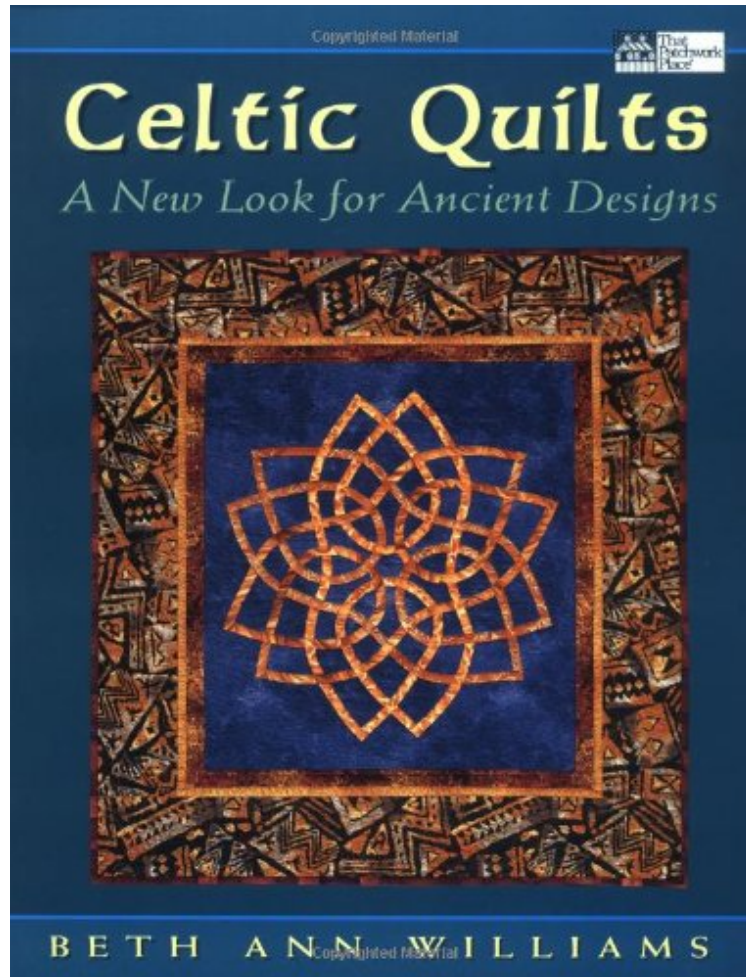

I can't believe how easy it is. I traced the lines on my background fabric and then glued to colored pieces into place. Then I used a Clover Bias Tape maker in the 1/4 inch width to make the Celtic knot. I was going to make another door quilt for winter by hand piecing a blue and white star from another book that resembles a snow flake, but decided to use this design again because it is so much faster. The author states on page 23 (too late; it belongs in the introduction) that projects can be hand applied and gives brief tips for the method, but the book focuses on machine work only. Readers are directed to use bias bars for making bias tape; no mention is made of alternate methods. That said, the book is an excellent resource for Celtic designs, with a variety of beautiful examples of the technique and patterns that can be reduced or enlarged.
